#### **BUDGET AND PRECEPT 2015/16.**

Budget 2014/15 Precept £69,000.00

Budget 2015/16 Precept £72,277.50

Precept increase £3,277.50 (4.75 %) - increase to Parish Council Rates per household 79 pence per year.

Residents will appreciate that Belmont Parish Council has always been prudent with any increase in our Precept. Historically we used to receive £8,000.00 from Durham County Council for double taxation (because we own Belmont Cemetery), we now receive nothing. The Local Council Grant in the current year was £4,924.00, the projection for this Government Grant is £4,124.00 a reduction of £800.00.

There will be an increase in costs for:- Staff Salaries, Stationary, Telephones, Electricity, Water, Insurance, Printing, BMX Track, Greens (extra cut path edges) and more. Various other costings have been reduced to accommodate our Budget for 2015/16.

#### **BELMONT SCRAMBLES**

The Parish Council has recently funded two important pieces of work:

- 1. Gates and other barriers have been installed at the various entrances to the Scrambles meadows, and it is hoped that these will keep out motor cycles and quad bikes which are such a nuisance and danger to pedestrians and dog-walkers.
- 2. The pruning of overhanging trees has been carried out to the rear of properties on Cheveley Walk and Birkdale Gardens, for which many residents have expressed their gratitude.

In the spring the Friends of Belmont Scrambles and the Friends of Belmont Library are arranging a joint talk by a spokesman from the RSPB about bird life on the Scrambles and how it can be promoted.

A table-top sale to raise funds for the Friends of Belmont Scrambles and to promote the group is to be held in the **Communal Hall, Broomside Lane on Saturday 14th March at 10.00 a.m.** 

The communal spring litter-pick has been provisionally arranged for **Sunday 22nd March** – anyone willing to give up an hour or so of their time is invited to come along.

Details of all these events will be posted in the library and on the Scrambles notice board. The Friends of Belmont Scrambles carry out regular maintenance work on the site and are always looking for new volunteers, young and old. Durham County Council is responsible for making the decision on all the planning applications received from the Belmont Parish area. If you have any views to express on any application that may affect you then you should raise these directly with the County Council.

Members of the public can access details of planning applications by logging onto the County Council website at www.durham.gov.uk/planning and entering the application number. Applications can also be found on the weekly planning list or by using the various search facilities on the site.

The Parish Council makes representation to the County Council on behalf of the community and council members who will formally consider planning proposals which could have major significance to the area. They will then come to a decision on whether to support, object to or offer no objections to a proposal. Although Belmont Parish Council cannot make decisions on planning applications residents are always welcome to speak at our monthly meetings or contact one of our councillors directly about any planning concerns.
