Transport is available on request at the parish office and buses will pick up from 12.00 noon.


#### **WELCOME TO OUR NEW PARISH CLERK**

She brings a wealth of experience to her new role and we wish her every success for the future. Mr Adrian Thurlwell will continue in his post as Assistant, increasing his hours from three to five mornings a week, and we're sure they'll make a great team!

#### **BELMONT WAR MEMORIAL IS NOW GRADE II LISTED**

Belmont War Memorial has recently been entered on "the List" of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest. The memorial is owned by Belmont Parish Council and Chairman Cllr Dennis Southwell said "We are naturally delighted by this award, made by the Secretary of State for the Environment. Grade II listing has also been confirmed by Durham County Council Planning Section." Mr Walter Meilkle, Chairman of the Friends of Belmont War Memorial, added "This recognition of the importance of Belmont War Memorial by Historic England is especially welcomed by our small group of local residents who formed the Friends of Belmont War Memorial some seven years ago. The group worked very hard in the first year to have the memorial moved to its present location where it is now in a much more central and prominent position. Since the move was completed the residents of the parish have taken the memorial to their hearts and this has created a greater understanding of the sacrifices made by those named on the memorial.



#### CARE CONNECT: A 24/7 service just up your street

We would like to make residents aware of Durham County Council's community alarm service, Care Connect, which supports vulnerable people of all ages by helping them to live independently in their own home. It provides a monitoring and response service to people's homes 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. Staff are always available to offer support and assistance, dispatch Responders to a customer's home, or contact the emergency services when necessary. Customers are provided with a unit alarm system and pendant, which is installed in their homes, and when the alert button is pressed for assistance a call is placed directly to Care Connect's Control Room.

Other types of equipment available include items for people who are at risk of falling, have dementia (or some memory loss), are deaf, blind, or have epilepsy. The service is vital for anybody who believes they are at risk, or vulnerable and their families want security and peace of mind. There is a small weekly charge for the service, but this will be discussed with customers prior to coming on to the service.
